
Questions

There are two types of questions: yes/no and information.

Yes/No Questions

- 1. The answer is "yes" or "no."
- 2. In a question with the verb "to be" (am, are, is), the verb moves to the front of the sentence.



Am/Are/Is	Subject	
Am	I	fluent?
Are	we you they	good at English?
ls	he she it	from Tibet?

3. In a question with an **action verb**, you need to add <u>do</u> or <u>does</u>.

Do/Does	Subject	Verb
Do	l we you they	study English?
Does	he she it	work today?

Information Questions

- 1. The answer is NOT "yes" or "no."
- 2. The answer gives more details (information).
- 3. Information questions have **questions words—who, what, where, why, when, how—**that start the sentence.

Question Word	To Be	Subject
Where	am	1?
Who	is	he? she? it?
How	are	we? you? they?

4. In a question with an **action verb**, you need to add <u>do</u> or <u>does</u> after the question word.

Question Word	Do/Does	Subject	Verb
Why	do	l you they we	study?
Where	does	he she it	go?
