

Memory: /r/ and /l/

To play Memory, first print the table below and cut out the words so that you have twenty cards. If you can, use a heavy paper so that you can't read the words through the paper.

Lay all of the cards face-down on the table in a rectangular formation. You and your student will take turns drawing two cards at a time. The goal is to find the most matching pairs by remembering where each card is on the board.

In this game of memory you will be focusing on pronunciation, so you and your learner will be looking for words that rhyme. Make sure to introduce the sounds and do lots of modeling so that your learner can successfully distinguish between the two sounds when you play the game.

Use this game to help your learner distinguish between the /r/ and /l/ sounds in English. Before you play, it might be helpful for your learner to go over the pronunciation of each word a few times. If you want to go further, you can work on the meaning of the words after your learner gets the hang of the game. Have fun!
